INTERSECTIONS: ART, DESIGN, AND THE NEON MUSEUM ON VIEW AT THE NEVADA HUMANITIES PROGRAM GALLERY

Las Vegas, NV – Nevada Humanities presents the exhibition *Intersections: Art, Design, and the Neon Museum,* on view June 2 through July 28, 2016, at the Nevada Humanities Program Gallery, located at 1017 S. First Street, #190, in downtown Las Vegas. *Intersections* features works that bring the visual artist and the commercial designer together to explore the distinctions and commonalities they share. Neon Museum staff, Cynthia Behr Warso, Education & Engagement Manager, and Maggie Zakri, Collections Manager curated this exhibition.

Intersections asks viewers to draw their own conclusions about the roles of artist and commercial designer - an artist who makes a work of their idea or expression versus that of the designer who works producing a product in collaboration with the goal of meeting a client's need. Both use specialized visual languages to create their works. Intersections, featuring collaborative works by visual artist Elena Wherry during her time as an artist-in-residence, proposed renderings for sign designs, and elements of a sign painters' handiwork on historic neon signs, helps viewers discover where the roles of a visual artist and a sign designer ends, begins, or possibly blends.

"Building upon the sense of our histories, and connecting it to a place and time in a shared experience is an exciting exploration that the Neon Museum provides," commented Nevada Humanities Executive Director, Christina Barr.
